

**Frontenac Stewardship Council
Dr. James Day Memorial Education Award**

The Frontenac Stewardship Council has been in existence for over 12 years and our geographic area of interest encompasses Frontenac County, including Wolfe & Howe Islands. The Council is run by volunteers that currently reside in communities across Frontenac County, including Wolfe and Howe Islands. It meets each month to discuss and decide how best to get the communities, groups and individuals from Frontenac County involved with stewardship initiatives for the area. Stewardship includes: hosting environment-related awareness events (e.g. loon workshop, forest products workshop); supporting lake & watershed planning (e.g. Fourteen Island Lake, Salmon River Watershed); fish & wildlife habitat enhancement (e.g. walleye spawning shoals, tree planting, bald eagle platforms); wetland enhancement (e.g. Bayfield Bay marsh) and much more.

Dr. James Day (1931 - 2011) was a member of the Frontenac Stewardship Council for many years. His passion for the environment led him to be involved in stewardship projects on Wolfe Island and in other parts of Canada.

The Council wishes to encourage younger people to embrace our vision : "A green and healthy landscape for this and future generations" To this end, in memory of Dr. Day, we are offering an award of \$1,000 to a deserving high school graduate looking to further their studies in an environmental area. The qualifications for consideration for this award are found below.

The successful applicant for this award

- will be a student who resides in Frontenac County or Kingston
- will be a high school student who has accepted a placement for September, 2011 at a Canadian College/University in a program dealing with environmental/natural resource issues
- will have demonstrated awareness of environmental concerns through involvement in school organizations and/or volunteer work and/or part time employment that focused on some aspect of the environment

Academic average will be a significant component of the selection process.
