Spring 2011 TREE AND SHRUB PLANTING PROGRAM

The Haliburton Highlands Stewardship Council is pleased to offer a native tree and shrub planting program to support private land stewardship in Haliburton County. Trees and shrubs are made available each spring to rural landowners and community organizations throughout the Stewardship Council catchment area on a “*first-come, first served*” basis. All orders must be PICKED UP at the time and location to be specified and will be subject to 13% sales taxes. Additional cold storage and transportation costs will apply.

Prices and species availability are subject to change, applicants will be notified before applications are reviewed.

Because these seedlings are bare-root, they need to be planted **right away** if they are to survive, which is why it is important to have a plan in place before-hand. If you have great planting ambitions, it is strongly recommended that you enlist the services of a Forestry Consultant in order to prepare a planting plan and attend a tree planting workshop.

Other Conditions and Criteria:

- The plants must not be resold or used for landscaping purposes. Plants should be used for the intended purpose at the site specified in the application. Plants can be used to rehabilitate open or harvested areas, to control erosion, create a windbreak or buffer, naturalize a shoreline, or create wildlife habitat.
- All applications must be accompanied by a photo of the site to be planted (digital preferred).
- Site preparation may be required by the landowner. There should be a reasonable expectation that properly planted trees will survive.
- Recipients should make a reasonable effort to control weeds or other competing species around the young plants, and provide adequate watering in the event of summer drought conditions, to help the plants get established.
- Landowners agree to allow Stewardship Council representative to visit their property for the purpose of assessing tree survival. Landowners will be contacted in advance to verify timing.

Additional Information:

Only plants native to Ontario and in the appropriate seed zone are supplied through this program. All orders include a series of fact sheet on handling, planting and tending techniques, pest control, species selection, and a variety of other related topics. Applications for spring 2011 are accepted throughout summer 2010 *while quantities last* up until Sept. 30th, 2010, and are usually distributed the first weekend in May, 2011. If you have missed the deadline, please contact the stewardship council.
