



2012 Spring Tree and Shrub Planting Program

The Peterborough County Stewardship Council, in partnership with neighbouring Councils in Northumberland County and the City of Kawartha Lakes, acquire, sell and plant over 100,000 trees and shrubs each year. The plants are made available each spring to rural landowners and community organizations throughout the Region. We have ordered approximately 18,000 trees and shrubs for the spring 2012 planting season in Peterborough County.

Rural residents in Peterborough County can reserve trees and shrubs on a “first-come, first served” basis.

Please consider the following items when placing your order:

1. Minimum order is 100 - please order in multiples of 10 – some species have maximum limits due to availability (see order form).
2. The trees and shrubs are bare-root reforestation stock – they are not landscaping trees. Most are between 12 and 18 inches in height.
3. Planting can be used to control erosion, create a windbreak, naturalize a shoreline, establish a wetland buffer, or create or enhance wildlife habitat.
4. Hardwood species and shrubs require extra care and time when planting – please gauge your order accordingly.
5. Landowners should make a reasonable effort to control weeds and other competing species around the young trees before and after planting to help them get established.
6. Landowners must agree to not commercially re-sell the trees and shrubs, i.e. commercial nurseries and landscaping companies.

The trees and shrubs will be available in late April of 2012. We will forward additional information regarding pick-up date and location early in April.

Make sure your trees are planted on the right site (soil and moisture) – see reverse side!
